#### Let's Unite Outdoors

What a lovely time we all had for the last session of the year of our **Let's Unite Outdoors** family group (for children and carers of primary aged children with special educational or additional needs). Katie, our wonderful forest school teacher, supported by Steve and Tracy hunted for bugs, helped

to build dens, make mud pies, and most popular of all, helped to build a camp fire on

which to roast marshmallows, make Smores and enjoy hot chocolate bought along by parents. Our Let's Unite Outdoors group in Tiverton provides a safe, supportive space for children to play, learn and make friends if they want to, and opportunities for parents to chat to others who understand. The sessions re-commence in the Spring (May) and run until September. In the meantime, parent carers can seek support



from our two groups for parent carers of children with additional needs – Let's Unite Peer Support Group on the  $1^{st}$  Wednesday of each month, starting at 9.30am and the Carers of Adults and Teenagers with Additional Needs on the  $3^{rd}$  Wednesday of the month, starting at 10.30am.

#### **Cullompton Carers Coffee Group**

On Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> November Carers going along to the **Cullompton Carers' Coffee Group** will be entertained by the talented Norman Ford and Arthur Wright who will be playing a variety of Scottish tunes on the electronic bagpipes and electronic snare drums (volume adjustable) followed by audience requests. Thank you to our wonderful group leader Jean Milne who is helping to facilitate this. The group begins at 10.30am at the Hayridge Centre, Cullompton.

#### **Tiverton Forget Me Not Café**

Our popular **Forget Me Not Café** - for carers and the people they care for - continues to thrive, ably lead by Denise Butt. On the Tuesday, 15<sup>th</sup> November the group is being joined by specialist Dave Monk from the Illegal Money Lending Team, to give a talk and advice on Loan Sharks – how to spot and take steps to avoid. The group begins at 2pm at Cherith Church, Tiverton. Please telephone the office if you would like to attend the talk but don't usually attend the FMNC group.

The December session of the Forget Me Not Café will be a week earlier than usual on 13<sup>th</sup> December starting at the usual time of 2pm.

## **Safe Stop Sitting Service**

Our **Safe Stop Sitting Service** in Tiverton is giving vital respite to unpaid carers across Mid Devon and our tiny charity - Unite Carers - is one of a very small number of organisations who are offering this service at present. Lead by the extremely experienced Jenny Tower and supported by a team of excellent volunteers, the warm and welcoming group offers a safe space for adult loved ones for 2 and

a half hours where they will be entertained with an array of enjoyable and thought-provoking activities. On Wednesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> November the group are being treated to a foot-tapping Christmas singalong by Brian Lawless on his guitar. Jenny has invited carers and their loved ones from the Forget Me Not Café to join them and refreshments are available. Plans are afoot to establish further Sitting Service groups in more rural areas, possibly Halberton and Witheridge, so please do let us know if you would like to be able to access another SSSS group at a location near to you, either as a carer or a volunteer.

#### **NEWS FROM OUR ADULT CARERS BEFRIENDING TEAM**

The Befriending Support Team continues to expand with several new requests for face to face Befriending Support from unpaid carers and a really positive response from volunteers coming back on board after covid restrictions. Between June – Aug 2022 Unite Carers registered 15 new unpaid carers and had 5 new requests for Befriending Support. For the period to date – September and October 2022 - we have had 14 new unpaid carer registrations and 8 new requests for Befriending Support. We warmly welcome each and every one of you to Unite Carers.

Befriending Support can be either in person over a coffee and a chat or through telephone support, or a combination of both. We try our best to match you with a like-minded person and if there's ever any problems, we're here to help. It's all about what works best for you.

Befriending Support isn't only available for new Carers to Unite. If you are feeling lonely and would like someone to talk to on a regular basis, please do get in touch with us; we're here to make life just a little bit easier for you.

We would love to recruit more volunteers of all ages to our Befriending Team, particularly from men to support men, so please do get in touch to find out more.

#### NEWS FROM OUR DEVON CARERS AMBASSADOR - FIONA BLADON

FREE Access to Leisure Centres for Unpaid Carers in Mid-Devon.

All unpaid carers in Mid-Devon, *and now including parent carers*, are currently able to access their local Leisure Centres with FREE annual membership, as part of a pilot running until the 31st of December this year. Free entry to the facilities at the Leisure Centre is being provided to unpaid carers on production of their Carers Passport from Devon Carers.

The Leisure Centres taking part in the pilot are:

- Culm Valley Sports Centre in Cullompton
- Exe Valley Leisure Centre in Tiverton
- Lords Meadow Leisure Centre in Crediton

More details on the facilities, opening times and location of the centres can be found on the Mid Devon Leisure website. Unpaid carers can access all activities, but classes and courts are advised to be booked in advance.

The trial was implemented following representations from Carer Ambassadors for improved access to leisure centres. This was then raised by Cllr James McInnes with the Devon Districts Forum, of which Cllr Bob Deed, the Leader of Mid Devon District Council, is the current Chair.

Unpaid carers can obtain a Carers Passport by registering with Devon Carers.

#### The Herbert Protocol

The Herbert Protocol form can be used in the event of an adult with care and support needs going missing. It contains vital information about the person at risk that can be passed to the police right at the point the person is reported missing.

Recording this information ahead of time, and keeping it regularly updated, will greatly reduce the stress associated with trying to recall detailed information in an emergency situation.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> October staff member Tracy Downs ran the London Marathon in aid of Unite Carers.

It was my first London Marathon and I was extremely nervous and not feeling very well at all for 2 days before, but I dosed myself up on the start line and had a fantastic time. I took lots of pictures, most of which didn't come out, and finished in a time of 5hrs 33mins. The crowd, the other runners and the organisers were incredible, lots of music to keep you going and lots of cheering. What a fabulous experience and I feel so lucky that I got a place.



As you can see, I wore my dad's Brentford FC football shirt for the run - Dad was a lifelong supporter of The Bees, as am I. Dad died from mesothelioma on 21st March this year after a 5-month battle. My mum, my brother and I were Dad's carers in those last few months and I thought of him often as I ticked along, especially as I was getting tired - it was nothing compared to what he had to endure. We did it Dad!

I'd like to say a massive thank you to everyone who has donated to Unite Carers and for everyone who wished me well. We have raised around £300.

## Spotlight On... In this edition we turn the spotlight on Tina Webber

Hi, my name is Tina Webber. I moved to Tiverton 5 years ago from a little village in South Devon called Buckfast and I have been volunteering for Unite Carers for 8 years. In my 20s I married and had 3 boys and between them I have 2 lovely grandsons.

I was diagnosed with MS in 1999 and my life changed a bit. When my boys left home, and finding it difficult to hold down a job with my MS, I asked myself – What could I do?

Previously I have worked in a residential home, as a home help and a childminder. I started to look for a charity to volunteer with and came across Unite Carers in Mid Devon. It was a great fit for me as my boyfriend (at the time) lived in Tiverton and it was a great way to get to know new people. We married in 2017.

I began my Unite Carers journey with Befriending and then I began helping at Tiverton Kids Who Care Club Nights. I think my first trip with KWC Young Carers was a day on the beach at Saunton Sands, and I was hooked from then on.

I started helping in the office printing, photo coping and doing some work on the database. I enjoyed helping some lovely people and making some great friends. As a volunteer I'm constantly meeting new people.

Later I started running "Tina's Craft Corner" for young carers at the Kids Who Care Club Nights in Tiverton, Crediton and Cullompton. This then led to doing activities at the Forget Me Not Café with Jackie Quaif. After the pandemic the opportunity came up to become a Trustee for Unite Carers and here we are.

I also run a lunch group separate to Unite for people with MS. Being a volunteer gave me the confidence to do this and volunteering continues to boost my self-esteem and confidence.
