Tiverton and Witheridge Safe Stop Sitting Groups

Norman and Arthur will be providing some of the entertainment at the Tiverton Safe Stop group on 12th July with toe-tapping renditions on the electronic bagpipes and drums (see Spotlight below on Norman).

The Safe Stop groups offer unpaid Carers an opportunity to take a break from caring while their loved one is kept safe and thoroughly entertained by our Safe Stop team.

The Witheridge Safe Stop group is the 3rd Tuesday of each month from 10.30am-12.30pm at Witheridge Parish Hall while Tiverton Safe Stop runs twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month at Cherith Church, Tiverton from 10am-12.30pm. There is a cost of £10 for each session, which includes refreshments. We are very flexible and encourage Carers to stay with their cared-for person if they wish, leave them safely with us if they wish, or a combination of both — whatever is best for you. If you would like to go along to either the Tiverton or the Witheridge group, and you haven't been before, please do give us a call at the office.

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Cullompton Carer's Coffee Group

Norman and Arthur will also be appearing at the Cullompton Carers' Coffee Group on 9th August. This group is facilitated by Jean and runs on the 2nd Wednesday of each month, starting at 10.30am at The Hayridge.

Tiverton and Cullompton Ex-Carers Lunch Group

The Tiverton and Cullompton Ex-Carers Lunch Group is an extremely popular lunch group facilitated by Veronica (Ronnie) Stone. It's on the first Monday of each month at different lunch venues each time and if you are a former unpaid carer looking for fun and friendship, you can find it here. All of our Carers' Support Groups are free to attend, with the exception of the Tiverton and Witheridge Safe Stop groups.

NEWS FROM OUR BEFRIENDING TEAM

Our dedicated volunteer Befriending Team has expanded over the last few weeks to provide even more support to unpaid Carers through our free face-to-face Befriending and Telephone Friendship services. We are now proud to say that we have 28 volunteers giving 1:1 Befriending and Telephone Friendship support and a further 10 volunteers available to provide form-filling, IT support and Counselling For Carers.

For the period April to June 2023, we have had 19 new unpaid Carers register with us and 15 new requests for 1:1 Befriending support. We warmly welcome each and every one of you to Unite Carers.

Befriending Support isn't only available for new Carers to Unite. If you are feeling lonely and would like someone to talk to, please do get in touch with us; we're here to make life just a little bit easier for you.

We are currently looking to recruit befriending volunteers who have lived experience of caring for a child, teen or adult with additional needs, who would be able to give specialised support, advice and friendship to others in a similar position. NEWS FROM OUR DEVON CARERS AMBASSADOR – FIONA BLADON



The **Lions Club** *Message in a Bottle* could prove helpful to you in the event of an emergency. Consider keeping a bottle for yourself and for the person you care for. The bottles and information forms are available free from your health centre, doctor's surgery, chemists and from some other venues like community centres and churches. The scheme was set up by the Lions Club International and the costs of running it are borne by local Lions Clubs.

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As the name suggests, information regarding personal and medical details is stored in the plastic bottle in the fridge, If the emergency services are called to your home and see a "green cross" label, they will be alerted to your membership of the scheme and look for the bottle in the fridge. Fix one label to the inside of your front door (or the door most used to access the premises) and the second to the outside of the fridge door.

To complete the form, you will need to add:

- Your full name and brief physical description
- Your doctor's name and the surgery address and telephone number
- A brief description of any medical conditions you are suffering from your doctor or carer will help if you are uncertain
- The names, addresses and telephone numbers of two persons who may be contacted in the event of an emergency sudden illness or accident
- Details of any pets which may be on the premises and need to be cared for
- If you are a carer, you will need to add information about the person you support

In addition, it is helpful to include your repeat prescription list, which is produced every time a repeat prescription is ordered. This information is of great value to the ambulance service as paramedics are able to administer drugs, but they need to know of any medication you are taking already to eliminate the risk of drug interaction.

The form also has a space for a passport size photograph to help with identification if there is more than one person living at the premises.

You may like to ask a relative, neighbour or Unite Carers to help you to complete the form. It can be useful to have a "spare" copy as, if called, the paramedics will take the one from the bottle.

Parent Carers - SEN Support in schools: A guide for parents and carers from DiAS

DiAS has published a new booklet about SEN support in schools. It's aimed at parents and carers, and it covers four main areas:

- What SEN support is and the kind of support that is, and should be, available in all schools.
- How support is planned and given in school, including the graduated response and school plans.
- Reasonable adjustments what these are and what's possible in schools.
- Getting specialist help and assessment what to do if support doesn't seem to be enough or right, and your child is still struggling.

Available as a PDF and a printed booklet, it takes parents and carers step by step through SEN support in schools, as well as setting out the law and everyone's rights and responsibilities. It's full of practical tips and advice and based on the questions the DiAS enquiry line staff get asked every day.

Autism and Us Parent Programme - Autumn Term 2023

Support from the Communication and Interaction Team - Education and Families (devon.gov.uk). Support for parents/carers of Devon primary and secondary children who are either on the autism assessment waiting list or who have received a diagnosis of autism.

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The 'Autism & Us' programme is being offered for the Autumn term for parents/carers of Devon primary and secondary school children, pre or post diagnosis. For families of children and young people who are currently on the autism assessment pathway, in addition to families of CYP who have received an autism diagnosis.

Attending the 'Autism & Us' parent programme gives you an opportunity to further develop your understanding of autism and look at practical solutions to managing and supporting your child's needs, whilst also connecting you with other parents/carers.

Four weekly live online sessions, approx. 2hrs each, related to the following themes:

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Volunteer Training - Dementia Awareness Training

We have access to Dementia Awareness training from the Devon Memory Consortium for our volunteers.

This online training course is designed specifically for people volunteering at memory cafes but would be useful for volunteers supporting at any of our Carers' Groups, or for volunteers supporting carers 1:1 with befriending and telephone friendship, or simply to expand your knowledge of dementia.

The course is delivered through a series of nine films and is illustrated throughout with the voices and experiences of people living with dementia.

The course is made up of 9 separate modules

- What is dementia?
- Memory
- Everyday tasks and recognition
- Perception
- Emotional impact
- Nothing to do with dementia
- Communication
- Different realities
- Behaviour does it matter?
