It's been another busy quarter for the Befriending Team and we continue to provide friendship and support to even more unpaid Carers with our face to face Befriending and Telephone Friendship services. For the period October to December 2022, we have had 26 new unpaid Carers register with us and 10 new requests for Befriending support. We warmly welcome each and every one of you to Unite Carers.

Befriending Support can be either in person over a coffee and a chat or through telephone support, or a combination of both. We try our best to match you with a like-minded person and if there's ever any problems, we're here to help. It's all about what works best for you.

Befriending Support isn't only available for new Carers to Unite. If you are feeling lonely and would like someone to talk to on a regular basis, please do get in touch with us; we're here to make life just a little bit easier for you.

As I passed the radio, I pushed the button on Alexander Armstrong. The music was

uplifting, but the news.... violent crime, death of "celebrities", the pound down against the dollar....
I tapped lightly on her door, opened it and crept in. She was fast asleep. She had tipped her water beaker over in the night and there was a puddle on the floor. I felt the edge of the bed under the duvet. It was wet. I turned and bent to pick up the crumpled loo paper on the floor beside the commode and my slippers squelched on the rubber backed mat. It was wet.
I closed my eyes against the hot tears which pushed defiantly between my eyelids and slid in salty tracks down my face. I left my urine-soaked slippers by the door and tiptoed out again.
A little while later, washed, dressed and breakfasted, Jane sat in her armchair watching the birds on the birdfeeder and happily chatting to Cathy, a lovely lady who came once a week to sit with her.
I struggled to restrain myself from running outside, arms outstretched, to embrace freedom. Okay, I was going food shopping and paying bills, but I was alleviated of responsibility and repetition for a few hours.

And I had coffee with other carers. Once a month, we escaped from our isolating bubbles of caring to socialise. Barriers down, no pretence. We were with other carers who knew and understood the frustrations, the smiles, the odd jokes, the endless heaps of washing, the tears, the joy, the pain, the fears, anxieties and uncertainties. We laughed, joked and swapped ideas and tips. We shared, we commiserated and we listened and most of all, we laughed.
